- **Highlights the diversity and individual experiences that are often left out of attempts to categorize a time period**
- **Examines the successes and struggles experienced by young people as they leave adolescence and move into and through their twenties**

CALL FOR PROPOSALS

The specific focus of the series is on flourishing and floundering in the diverse paths young people take into and through the third decade of life. The series is devoted to examining broadly the complexity of these pathways from a variety of perspectives and disciplines (e.g., fields ranging from developmental psychology and neurobiology to education, sociology, and criminology). Hence, those in a variety of fields are encouraged to contribute to the series. Books will not be limited in their scope to viewing this period through the lens of emerging adulthood theory. For inclusion in the series, a book must examine various beliefs/attitudes, attributes, behaviors, relationships, or trends during the third decade.

PROPOSAL PROCESS

Books will be both invited by the Series Editor and proposed by potential authors or book editors. A broad range of researchers and scientists are invited and encouraged to submit a formal proposal for consideration. Contact the Series Editor or Oxford University Press for the required proposal format. The Series Editor is also happy to discuss possible books and ideas prior to the proposal being submitted.
